Closed on Sundays

Last month, Os Hillman sent out a devotional with this title and it caught my eye because of course the church would **NEVER** be closed on Sundays, so I was intrigued to read on.

His devotion was based on verse 14 from Exodus 31..."Observe the Sabbath, because it is holy for you."

As I read on I realized that Os was not talking about church – he was talking about Chick-fil-A – it's America's second-largest fast food chicken joint. The company's stated corporate purpose is to...

"Glorify God by being a faithful steward of all that is entrusted to us, and to have a positive influence on all who come in contact with Chick-fil-A."

The company is a great example of a business that is modeling Christian values and producing a quality product in the competitive fast-food industry. According to Os, Chick-fil-A is one of the fastest-growing chains nationally, currently with over two billion dollars in annual sales.

One of the defining distinctions of Chick-fil-A is that the restaurants are **not open on Sundays**. From the time the company's founder started in the restaurant business in 1946, he believed that God wanted him to honor the Sabbath by keeping the stores closed on Sundays. Although he was challenged on this idea many times by shopping mall operators, he always held that "we will have more sales in six days than those who are

open for seven." This has proven to be true, and today it is no longer an issue to fulfill the malls' requirement to remain open on Sunday."

I've often imagined how full church would be if Target, Wall Mart and the malls weren't open on Sunday mornings – or there wasn't soccer practice or swim teams and the like. I love Sundays because it's a "holy" time when we gather as a community, as a family, as the body of Christ.

So, I just thought I'd remind everyone again that Christ the King will never be closed on Sundays. In fact, we'll be open all summer. I know lots of families will be travelling and vacationing and doing fun things over the summer, and I celebrate that with you. I know we won't have Sunday School or Confirmation over the summer, but our church will be open. I hope that if you're in the area you will consider it your duty and delight to "observe the Sabbath because it is holy for you." being with us in worship – same time as always, 8:30 and 11.

We'll be here, and hope to see you when you're in town and want to add to our "holiness" by your presence.

Have a fun and safe summer. See you in church!!

I bet that at some time in your life you said to a kid, "When I was your age . . ." And then you cringed internally and thought "Oh my gosh, I can't believe I said that, I sound just like my [parent]!" And the kid's reaction? Blank stare. The child has no clue what you are talking about and can't even imagine it.

And if it's hard for kids to imagine what we were like when we were young, it's much harder for them to imagine Jesus when he was young. Because, of course, he was young once. He was a boy like every other boy, a boy who loved anything with wheels and was irresistably drawn to mud puddles. Did you ever think about that?

Picture Jesus as one of a pack of kids playing all day in the town, laughing and joking with one another. On the way home they pet their favorite sheep, stop at the marketplace for a snack and to linger with the vendors, and toss a ball back and forth.

And all of the adults in town watch for them along the way, chiding them if they dawdle and indulging their enthusiasm. Because it takes a village to raise a child, and it took the village of Nazareth to raise Jesus.

This August, travel back in time to Nazareth and be part of the village raising Jesus. Show the children of Vacation Bible School what Jesus' life was like when he was a kid just like them. Go with them to visit his mother Mary (because she's the cool mom and everyone wants to hang out there!). Be one of the vendors in the marketplace where you show them how you make your wares. Raise a joyful noise in celebration with inspiring, uplifting music that will keep you singing for years to come!
