Mid-week Advent Series – *From the Heart of God*

Wednesdays at noon and 7:30 pm in the Sanctuary

November 30, December 7, 14, and 21

In this season of Advent we will use the texts from the Gospel of Luke to prepare for the celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas. The Advent series seeks to take the sentimentality of Christmas and turn it to the incredible heart of God. The four gatherings in this season will focus on how God's deep desire is to be in relationship with humankind. Each text shows how the heart of our God discloses itself in our real world. God did not choose a perfect or ideal world in which to invest God's eternal love. God chose this world: with all of its imperfections and possibilities; weakness and courage; unbelief and faith. And God chose to come in a manner that we could access: a human being. The Christ-child is the longing of God's heart to embrace a fallen humanity and heal a broken world. This isn't sentimentality—this is a *real faith for a real world*.

POWER SURGE

As most of you are aware, we've spent the last eight weeks or so learning what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. We've been talking about the marks of a disciple — the spiritual tools that facilitate becoming disciples of Jesus Christ.

With **POWER SURGE** as our theme, we've been talking about ways that we as God's people can grow deeper in our discipleship to Christ. My heartfelt prayer is that this has been a time in which all of us have been able to make the connection between our faith and the everyday decisions and events that confront us. As we begin this new chapter in the life of our congregation together, we must be grounded again in those things that will never change. These are the truths of Scripture made known in the Savior, Jesus Christ.

So, I am asking a difficult thing of those of you who worship and serve at Christ the King. I'm asking you to put your faith into practice, through this surge of power that we call the Marks of Discipleship.

The **POWER** is in —

Prayer - Worship - Reading the Bible

This **POWER** establishes the inner terrain of practicing our faith.

Daily prayer establishes our lives in a living relationship with God. The God of Jesus who is always accessible meets us in our praying. Through an active prayer life, we are led by the Spirit of God every day in making the small and big decisions of life. Daily prayer connects us to God.

Daily Bible reading takes the connection with God established by prayer a step further. It exposes our ideas of God to the truths of Scripture. In this way, our ideas of God are subject to the "God who alone is God." Reading the Bible daily also challenges us to live our faith. While prayer is an inner way that can be private, daily Bible reading reminds the

believer that a personal relationship with God can never be private. It is a relationship that affects not only how we think, but how we act. The Bible teaches us of God's expectation that we worship in the community of other believers.

Weekly worship plugs us in...to the power of the faith of others. Weekly worship is a discipline that brings great rewards: we can be confident that we are not alone in trying to practice our faith and help shape the world around us for good in Jesus' name. Worship renews our commitment to live what we believe as we encourage and care for one another in the presence of God.

The **SURGE** is in —

Serving - Relationships - Giving

Disciples are those who live their lives in service because we have been served by God through the death and resurrection of Jesus. The mission of the Christian isn't just within the congregation, however. We are equally in service as disciples when we see our community involvement as an extension of our personal mission.

Relationships form the fabric of our lives. God frequently uses our relationships to call us to spiritual growth. This invitation is first to care about those with whom we relate. Then, as they know our genuine love, we strive to grow together in the power of the Spirit. This means that authentic relationships provide the very best context for our Christian witness.

Giving is about stewardship and specifically about financial stewardship. We need always to be giving from the gifts that have been given to us by God — time, talents and, yes, treasures. Christians care more about the souls of others than about their pocketbooks. But because we care about the soul, we must speak of the pocketbook. Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." For us disciples to surge into this new and challenging time in the power of our faith, we must be willing to invest our "treasure" in

the faith that we take to heart. Tithing is God's foundation for giving. Tithing is the practice of trusting God in the real world of our personal finances. But we give because God has first given to us. Christians tithe out of gratitude, not fear. This connects us to the ongoing faithfulness of our God in a concrete way.

POWER SURGE is our spiritual toolkit for aligning our lives to the discipleship calling of the Savior, Jesus. May our goal simply be to be empowered as God's people, as disciples of Christ, with a faith that brings the power of the Holy Spirit into our daily lives and enables us to share the love of our Savior with the entire world.

We will come together as a community of faith on November 20 to make a commitment to the future of our church. Whether or not you have ever pledged, please consider pledging generously and from the heart for the sake of the future of our congregation.

Our Sunday school programs have never been larger – both children and adult. Our service committee has identified an unbelievable number of opportunities for those in need right here in the Northern Virginia area, an area which is one of the most prosperous in the nation. And we now have a stabilized church pastor and staff that are offering limitless areas for all of us to become better disciples of Jesus Christ. Have you considered where your ministry strengths are and how you can share them through the ministries of our church?

I must add however, that none of this can reach its full potential without your time, talents and financial resources. As the church council has attempted to communicate through our weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter (see page 8 of this newsletter), Christ the King has been in transition for about two years and thus has seen a period of decreasing offerings and increasing expenses. Said another way, our cash flow has been negative and needs to be corrected before we go into 2012. We not only need everyone to consider increasing their current pledge amount for 2012, but to seriously consider making a special onetime contribution to bring our operating cash position up to an acceptable level before the end of this year. We need to recover from a current \$30,000 deficit before the end of the year so that we begin 2012 in the black. Please consider helping us out!

Do you realize just how strong Christ the King would be if everyone did just a littleand then a little more?



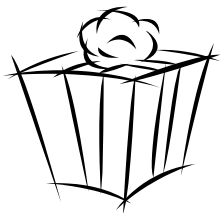
